By increasing opportunities to interact with upperclassmen, we will develop the children's ambition to "be better" through admiration and the desire to imitate older children.




Pathways from Kindergarten to High School

The 2-year-old is at the beginning of the "awakening of the ego". They want to do many things "on their own," and their "yes" and "no" answers are becoming clearer. The Pre-K Department focuses on these "hanges in the brain and heart," and encourages children to ask "Why?". We value the curiosity of "Why?". We give them "a little confidence" by recognizing, praising, and delighting them when they can do something on their own, and encouraging them to do their best when they are having trouble. After a "play-based" childcare program, we will move on to the "International Baccalaureate Education" starting from the 3-year-old class.

FAQs

Q Is the kindergarten eligible for free tuition?

Yes. Kindergarten students from dual-income families are eligible. Please apply to your local municipality and we will process your application.

6 May I bring my own lunch?

Please feel free to bring your own lunch. We can order lunches Δ and snacks from caterers with advance notice. We can also accommodate those with milk and egg allergies.

Q Are there naps or outside playtime?

Naps are from 2:15 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. and are available for children who use the extended care program. For outside play, each class has one out-of-school activity at the park each week. The rooftop is covered with artificial grass to provide a safe environment for class activities and free play.

How do you approach Japanese and English? Q

Daily class activities are basically conducted in English. Depending on the proficiency level of each child, we will also provide support in Japanese.

Flow of April enrollment and midway enrollment

If you are considering enrolling your child in our preschool, please visit us to observe classes (by appointment only). We do not strictly require any level of English ability from your child at the time of enrollment. It is important knowing our school philosophy and vision. If there are available slots in a class, we will also offer enrollment during the course of the school year. Please contact us for details.



Q I want to know how extended care works

Extended Day Care is available from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. after the end of regular class pick-up time. Nap time is from 2:15 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. After that, your child will join the extended care group. A dedicated extended care staff member will be available to take care of the children until their parents come to pick them up.

What nationalities are represented among Q the teachers and students?

The majority of our students are Japanese. Foreign Α teachers in the childcare and kindergarten departments are Japanese, American, British, and Filipino. In the elementary school and above, more than 11 nationalities support our global education!

What is the maximum number of students Q in each class?

The 2-year-old class has a capacity of 12 children, Α and the 3 to 5-year-old classes have a capacity of 25 children each. This is a system that allows each child to receive individual attention and care.
